Title of the research project

The Political Legacy of Sexual Violence: The Marocchinate

Description of the research project

During WWII, French Moroccan troops engaged in mass rapes of the local population during the liberation of Italy. We would like to ask: Why do people residing in areas with more historical exposure to Moroccan rapes vote more for far-right parties since the 2018 elections?

Process

Scientific research

What is the legal basis for the processing of the personal data?

Consent

Direct from data subjects

Which data subjects are involved in the research?

Adults residing in the Italian regions Tuscany, Abruzzo, Campania, Lazio, Molise & Umbria as recruited by survey company CINT.

What personal data are used?

The (anonymous) survey will ask questions about beliefs and attitudes. First, we will ask several questions to elicit the general attitudes towards Syrian and other refugees to confirm that respondents from these municipalities indeed look more negatively towards immigrants. Second, we will ask questions how concerned people are about, e.g., labor market competition with refugees, fears of cultural annihilation by refugees, fears of sexual violence through refugees, etc. This is done in order to establish the reasons WHY these attitudes persist. Third, we will ask for general demographics (such as age, gender, education levels) as well as municipality of residence of their ancestors during World War II. This is done to control for the effects of internal migration.

Which safeguards are in place for this research project?

Ethical assessment

The research protocol was approved by the Review Board of TiSEM under application number FUL 2024-004.

Survey administered via Qualtrics. Data stored on SurfDrive and archived on Dataverse.

Will data be disclosed to third parties, and if so, to which parties?

The research takes place together with Riccardo Ghidoni (U Bologna). They receive (part of) the data and there are good contractual agreements in place establishing the purposes for which data is shared and the required security measures.

How long will the data be stored?

10 years for the purpose of further scientific research.

Research data is anonymized as soon as possible and stored for 10 years to ensure scientific integrity.

Once data has been anonymized, it cannot be traced back to you, and this privacy statement no longer applies.

Your rights
